**Corporate Reading Guide:**

This week we'll continue reading through Leviticus to prepare our hearts for the Sunday gathering. Read through Leviticus chapters 16, 23, and 25 this week and consider: What do these chapters teach you about; (1) God and His Holiness, (2) Yourself and Your Sinfulness and (3) God's Plan of Redemption.

**Discussion Questions:**

1. What impacted you and/or what did you learn from this week's sermon?
2. Did you have any questions on these chapters or topics that were not covered on Sunday?
3. Read Leviticus 11:44-45 and 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24. How does God's promise to one day sanctify us completely give us hope as we pursue holiness today?
4. Read Leviticus 11:1-2 and 1 Corinthians 10:31. What are some practical ways we can be mindful and worshipful of the holiness of God – even when we eat?
5. Read Leviticus 15:31 and Mark 7:14-23. How should the truth of our indwelling uncleanness and sin humble us?
6. Read Leviticus 17:8-9. What are some areas of our worship that may be only partial – or in other words – how can we strive for wholly holy worship?
7. Read Leviticus 18:1-5 and Hebrews 13:4. Why is it so dangerous for us to view sex in marriage as something embarrassing or something to be ashamed of? How is this what is truly depraved, perverse, and abominable?
8. Read Romans 10:1-4. How does Christ serving as the End of the Law give us hope in our daily lives?
